Explorers: PRE-K

Explorers summer programs are designed with incoming and current pre-k students in mind. Building on our philosophy that we can respect our students to lead the way even from an early age, our educators pair imagination, wonderinducing experiences, fun child-centered activities, and play for safe, engaging, and memorable experiences all summer long. Pre-K students have their own class spaces, rest spaces, playground, and designated educators and assistants for the entire summer.

Pre K: A single group of up to 15 for students in, or going into, Pre-K and not a rising Kindergartener (ages 4 years + 2 months through 4 years + 11 months).

Our ratio for this age group is 4 adults to 15 students.

This camp class has a pricing option for half day (8 AM-1 PM) or full day.

SPACE IS THE PLACE WEEK 1: JUNE 24-28

This is the week we learn about stars, constellations, planets, the moon, the sun, and everything in between! Campers can collaborate on building a 3D solar system, make constellation and galaxy art, and learn about the planets in our solar system.

CREATE AND BUILD WEEK 2: JULY 1-3

Drawing from the concept of Loose Parts Play, campers will explore their creativity through building, playing, and creating with open-ended materials. Campers will be challenged to think outside the box and let their imagination go wild!

WE ARE THE DINOSAURS! WEEK 3: JULY 8-12

This week we will go back to the land of the dinosaurs! Campers will learn about prehistoric dinosaurs big and small! Campers will have the opportunity to make mini volcanoes and make them erupt!

CAMP OES GOT TALENT WEEK 4: JULY 15-18

Campers will explore their talents and all the awesome and amazing things they can do! They will be encouraged to let their talents shine in a variety of different ways such as dancing, painting, drawing, acting and more! We hope to put on a talent show for other campers at the end of the week!

MAD MAD SCIENCE WEEK 5: JULY 22-JULY 26

This week, we will do group experiments and creations. Homemade playdough and oobleck, matter, egg drops, and more. What makes a plant grow? What makes something float? We will put on our labcoats and goggles, learn about science safety, and have fun!

ANIMALS FROM A-Z WEEK 6: JULY 29-AUGUST 2

We're going on a lion hunt! Get your binoculars and get ready to learn about the safari! Where do animals in the zoo come from? What do they like to eat? This week we will make and wear safari explorer vests, follow some animal tracks we'll find around the camp, and make masks of our favorite safari/zoo animal. After a long day of exploring the safari we will wind down with some wild animal yoga.

ONCE UPON A TIME WEEK 7: AUGUST 5-9

Get ready to step into a camp of make believe! Your camper will experience the magic created when imagination and creativity combine at Once Upon a Time Camp! Campers will create castles and brew their potions and make friends with dragons, trolls, fairies, and more! Your camper will harness their creativity and explore all they can do and create!

Our seeker students seek and find things they absolutely love to do. Summer is all about having the time to seek out who we are. We're proud to provide well rounded programs for our young campers to discover the wonder of the season through Art, STEM, Movement/Athletics, and time well spent in Nature and Outdoors. Each and every camp program builds joy and respect through play, and provides a wealth of opportunities for students to build their wonderings through inquiry-based and childcentered camp classes that will bring out the fun only summer can offer.

Classes spend two-thirds of the day in their educator developed class structure and the last one-third exploring enrichment activities. These classes are intended for rising kindergarten and first graders.

WEEK 1: JUNE 24-28

SEW HAPPY

Thread, cloth, stuffing! Using our imaginations and simple hand sewing techniques we will work to bring our project designs to life! Project will vary from simple bags, stuffed creatures or pillows along with opportunities for child imagined and created designs. Daily outdoor explorations to the diverse environments on our campus including wetlands, forests and fields will support our work as researchers and makers--whether it's collecting plants for fabric dying or using play to imagine creatures to bring to life in fabric!

CIRCUS ARTS

We empower children to explore their curiosities and embrace healthy risks in trying new things. With a dedicated focus on fostering respectful relationships through group goal setting and clear instructions and boundaries. We do many team building theater activities that supports the group and community feeling. Campers not only delve into physical theater and collaborative projects but also learn about setting their goals and boundaries, offering encouragement to others and cultivating a supportive environment where everyones imagination and joy can thrive.

PACK YOUR BAGS

Embark on a whirlwind global adventure, where each day unveils the enchanting cultures of Spain, Japan, and Mexico. With passports in hand, campers will immerse themselves in hands-on activities that capture the essence of each country. Japan introduces the art of Candy Sushi, turning colorful candies into delightful sushi shapes. In Mexico, craft your own sombrero and take a swing at a vibrant piñata fiesta. Finally, in Spain, create castanets and beautifully adorned fans, mastering the rhythmic beats and graceful movements of Spanish traditions. This isn't just a camp; it's a passport to a week filled with exploration, creativity, and the thrill of discovering the wonders of three incredible countries. Let the global adventure begin!

TALL, TALLER, TALLEST

In this camp, students will reach for the sky, learning about the tallest buildings and structures around the world throughout history, as well as the stories behind them. Students will have the opportunity to construct models of their favorite worldwide skyscraping structure, learning about the principles of design and engineering behind them. Our cumulative project will be a collective construction of our own super-tall miniature building using recycled materials and the architectural strategies we have learned about.

WEEK 2: JULY 1-3

NATURE DREAM TEAMS

How does nature use team work to make the dream work? What can we learn from creatures in the wild who work together? In this class, we will learn about the concept of symbiotic mutualism-the phenomenon of plants and animals who work together, playing to their unique strengths, for mutual benefit. From the clownfish and the anemone to the Remora fish and the shark, students will learn to identify teams of animal friends and their unique reciprocal relationships. We will reflect on the ways in which our own friendships and relationships also include examples of mutualism, as we learn to value playing to our strengths and helping each other, using team work to make the dream work.

ACROSS THE UNIVERSE

Join us in an imaginary excursion to the outer reaches of space. Are you amazed by the images from the James Webb telescope or do you dream of traveling to Mars someday? During the week we will explore the universe through games, storytelling, the arts and science. Collectively, students will work together to imagine a trip into outer space then dig in together. Daily outdoor explorations to the diverse environments on our campus including wetlands, forests and fields will support our work as explorers, observers and researchers.

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WEEK 3: JULY 8-12

SENSES WORKING OVERTIME

Our experience of the world is a multisensory one. When we think of human senses we often think of eyesight, hearing, taste, touch and smell. But what about other senses. like how we sense movement, time. temperature? And did you know there are some senses that are only found in the animal world? Join us to explore our senses through movement, music, the arts and science. Daily outdoor explorations to the diverse environments on our campus including wetlands, forests and fields will support our work as explorers, observers and researchers.

BECOME AN ARTIST

Through this arts and crafts exploration camp, we'll discover fun ways to incorporate nature into art, utilizing STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts, math) with a focus on art to discover new elements of creativity, and having fun with other artistic mediums such as clay, yarn, paint, and beads. We'll spend the week engaging in fun projects together, building our camp community, and at the end of the week, you can participate in a gallery walk to share the things that you've made.

SEASONAL WONDERS

Welcome to the Seasonal
Wonders Camp, where each day brings a unique adventure through the enchanting tapestry of the four seasons!

Campers hone their soccer skills in morning sessions, practicing shooting, turning, passing drills etc while experiencing some soccer silliness in the afternoon with games like soccer tennis, scooter soccer, soccer golf and more! THE JOY OF DANCING

ARTFUL BIRDS

Have you ever imagined what it would be like to be a bird? To have wings and soar? What kind of wings would you have? What kind of beak? Would you dive, fly, flap, soar? In Artful Birds, we will observe and investigate the wetlands and forest habitats at OES to see what kinds of birds call the campus home. With nature as our inspiration, we will use art and natural materials to create our own birds, bringing our ideas to life as we design, create, and test our wings!

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ALLIDAYS

Campers will have the opportunity to expand their knowledge on holidays and traditions from many different cultures and parts of the world. This will allow campers to develop compassion as they learn about holidays that they may not celebrate themselves but are important to people all around them. Campers will listen to read aloud's such as. How to Catch a Dragon, Too Many Tamales, Binny's Diwali, and Shmelf the Hanukkah Flf. Campers will have fun this week through creative, hands on projects. Possible activities could include: decorating gingerbread houses, making masks for Mardi Gras, learning how to play spin the dreidel, and making paper lanterns for Chinese New Years. Campers will also have choice time in the morning where they get to choose from a variety of different stations to explore. These inquiry based projects will provide students with opportunity to expand their knowledge and curiosities about holidays that are new to them in fun and engaging ways!

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WEEK 6: JULY 29-AUGUST 2

LITTLE CHEFS

A culinary adventure designed especially for our youngest aspiring chefs in grades K-1! In this delightful camp, your little ones will explore the world of cooking without ever needing an oven. Each day brings a new recipe, a new skill, and a lot of delicious fun. From crafting fruity kabobs to assembling colorful no-bake cookies, and even creating their very own Pizza Roll-ups, our mini chefs will embark on a hands-on iourney through the basics of food preparation, kitchen safety, and the joy of creating their own tasty masterpieces. Our adventure continues with refreshing Fruit Parfaits, where kids will laver vogurt, granola. and an assortment of fresh fruits to create a visually appealing and tasty treat. With a focus on non-bake recipes, we'll turn simple ingredients into sensational snacks, ensuring every child discovers the joy of being a chef in the most playful and delectable way possible. Join us for "Little Chef's" where the kitchen transforms into a place of creativity, learning, and, most importantly, yummy memories!

MARVELOUS MATH

In this camp class campers will take a different component of math with hands on, engaging, and fun activities to explore and learn more about those strategies. We will begin learning about number sense exploring counting and addition and subtraction. On day two we will will have build and create with the world of shapes in geometry. On day three we will learn, build, create, and eat our fraction creations. On day four we will measure ourselves, friends. and different items around us. On day five will will travel for our field trip and wrap up our week with patterns and comparing and contrasting. Each day will involve rich vocabulary and read alouds to help students define ourselves and mathematicians.

CONTRAPTIONS & REACTIONS

Campers will work with peers to problem solve, design and assemble their creations, as well as experimenting with chemical reactions! From catapults to slime, circuits to elephant toothpaste, students will use hands-on and inquiry based learning to gain a better understanding of why and how things work. Campers will explore physics, engineering, and chemistry concepts such as: gravity, kinetic energy, projectile motion, chemical bonds, friction, simple machines, and more!

This camp class provides a ground for our student campers to meet grown-ups who have worked exclusively in one area or explored multiple paths. To expand our K-1 students summer experiences, healthy risk taking, and easy inquiry classes rotate through one station a day from 2:30-4 p.m. Please find descriptions of our specials below.

THE LAB

Students will find their way through the wonders of beginning engineering, hands on chemistry, states of matter and more in this experientially focused afternoon activity that brings the scientist out in everyone.

MAKERSPACE

At the heart of every question is an answer. Inquiry is a foundational learning principal of OES and here in Makerspace students will have open exploration to developmentally appropriate stations the drive inquiry, creativity, leadership, teamwork, and autonomy skills. The key is - they just think they're having fun!

ARTS & CRAFTS

Students openly explore textiles, air dry clay, painting, and paper through project examples or their own artistic imagination and flare.

NATURE EXPLORATION

With 59 acres to explore, including two learning gardens, a tree grove, wetlands, and open field areas students will have the opportunity to look up, down, underneath, and all around in outdoor education activities. Like other afternoon environments, nature exploration is student driven and station based, allowing for a whole range of interests to be met in the beauty of the outdoors.

This week will include opportunities to climb at one of Portland's finest climbing gyms as well as use the facilities (the SPARC and Farris climbing wall) at OES. WEEK 3: JULY 8-12

UNDER WATER

We will also be exploring ideas of ocean ecosystem conservation and how to best keep our beaches, oceans, and homes healthy.

STEAM ADVENTURE

Get ready for an adventure! STEAM adventure is an exciting camp where campers will get to explore all things science, technology, engineering, math art and science. Campers will participate in a scavenger hunt around campus each day that will reveal the daily stem challenge. Campers may build solar ovens, create magnificent towers, design their own bridges and more!

ART IN NATURE

In this class students will explore art through nature. Students will use materials gathered from nature to make unique and expressive artworks. Through hands-on activities of drawing, painting, and sculpting, students will develop their artistic skills, while exploring the beauty of nature.

CITY BUILDERS: MYTHS & LEGENDS


