Getting to Camp

From Omaha:

Take Maple Street west until it turns into 275. Stay on 275 for 7 miles after it turns into a 4 lane highway. Take the Bennington exit - turn left and go under the overpass. At the intersection you have to turn either left or right. Turn right and travel 4.2 miles to the first street light. Turn left onto the Industrial Route By-Pass'. The By-Pass becomes Cloverly. You will travel on the By-Pass/Cloverly for 1.5 miles. Cloverly dead ends at the intersection with Highway 77. Turn left (south) onto Highway 77. Travel approximately 2 miles, cross the Platte River Bridge and turn right on Riverview Road. Turn Right on County Road 13 and stay on that road for .5 miles until you arrive at Calvin Crest. The office is between the Upper Area Lodge and the Proett Conference Center.

From Lincoln:

Travel north on Highway 77 through Wahoo. At the red light on the north side of Wahoo travel north on Highway 109 for 14 miles. At the stop sign at Cedar Bluffs turn east (right) and stay on Highway 109 for 1 mile. Turn north (left) on County Road 13 (a gravel road) Continue on the road for 1.5 miles until you arrive at Calvin Crest. The office is between the Upper Area Lodge & the Proett Conference Center.

From Fremont:

Take Highway 77 south, through Inglewood and across the Platte River bridge. Immediately after crossing the Platte River Bridge turn right on Riverview (County Road Y). The blacktop road becomes a gravel road. Stay on the gravel road for another .5 miles and you will come to an intersection with a sign indicating Calvin Crest is to the right. Turn right at that intersection and stay on that road for .5 miles until you arrive at Calvin Crest. The office is between the Upper Area Lodge and the Proett Conference Center.

We are a year-round camp, conference and retreat center located on 250 scenic acres of woods, fields and rolling hills overlooking the Platte River in Fremont, Nebraska.

Calvin Crest is a place where your child can grow in mind, body, and spirit in an area of scenic beauty. Part of the Calvin Crest tradition is familiarizing campers with the outdoors, and helping them understand the natural beauty that surrounds them. Camp Check-In

Check in time is 3:30-4:30 PM on Sunday. Exceptions to this are Family Camp (10:00 AM on Saturday) and Explorers (7:00 PM on Friday).

Camp Check-Out

Camps are finished by 5:00 PM on the last day. Exceptions include Sr. High Camps (10:00 AM), Family Camp (1:00 PM) and Explorers (1:00 PM).

Transportation

Each camper is responsible for getting to Calvin Crest and returning home. It there are several campers from one church, you may wish to carpool.

Cell Phones

Please do not send cell phones, or tell your campers to call you from camp. This interrupts the camping program and can increase home-sickness. Please partner with us as we encourage campers to connect with each other in real and tangible ways.

Social Media Policy

Social networking sites, such as Facebook, are a large part of today's society, and are a part of self-expression. However, some of the content that goes on to such sites is not necessarily appropriate. In order to have a positive image for both your child and for the camp, Calvin Crest abides by this policy. Things to Leave at Home Dress Code

Dress is casual but modest at camp. Please bring clothing and swim suits that are appropriate in our Christian community. This includes one-piece swim suits for girls and swim trunks for guys. Tank tops should have straps that are at least two fingers wide. All shirts should cover the top of the pants when arms are raised. Campers wearing Tshirts with slogans deemed inappropriate may be asked to wear the tshirt inside out or change into an appropriate shirt. All campers must wear closed toed shoes at all times, except in the pool. Sandals are appropriate for pool areas, but NOT for daily wear. Bring tennis shoes or hiking boots. Ranch campers are REQUIRED to have boots or shoes with a heel and long pants or they will not be permitted to ride the horses. If you are in doubt about what is appropriate, please contact the Calvin Crest Office. You may want to bring two pairs of enclosed shoes like tennis shoes or hiking boots (in case one gets wet). For safety reasons, campers will not be allowed to go barefoot at any time. In addition, slippers, sandals or open-toed shoes are only to be used to go to the pool or the shower.

Health Form

A completed health form is required to complete the registration process. This form allows you to communicate with our health staff about your child's health. Please provide accurate information and update it as needed during check-in.

Camp Health Care

There will be a health care supervisor to see that campers receive proper medical attention if needed. The health care staff will also see that campers take their medication on schedule. All medications should be clearly marked with the campers name, dosage, etc. and given to the Health Care Supervisor when checking in.

ALL MEDICATION, PRESCRIPTION AND OVER THE COUNTER, MUST COME IN ITS ORIGINAL PACKAGING/BOTTLE THAT IDENTIFIES THE PRESCRIBING PHYSICIAN (IF A PRESCRIP-TION), THE NAME OF THE MEDICATION, THE DOSAGE AND THE FREQUENCY OF ADMINISTRATION.

Medication can only be administered to the person who is named on the prescription. In case of emergency or illness lasting more than 12 hours, parents will be notified.

Changing Events

All changes must be confirmed with the Registrar. There is a \$10 fee for each change.

Cabin Mates

Up to three friends may request to bunk together. Please indicate your bunkmates on your registration form. Due to space limitations, not all bunkmate requests can be honored. Cabin Mates may not always be placed in the same activity group.

Cost

The camp fee includes lodging, meals, snacks, crafts, activities, one camp photo and a Camp T-Shirt. Note: T-Shirt sizes will not be guaranteed on registrations received after April 30. Campers can bring spending money for the camp store at the parent's discretion (\$10-\$20 is plenty). The Store has stamps, postcards, shirts, and other small items.

Financial Aid

Many churches provide financial help to children and youth who wish to attend camp. Calvin Crest has limited campership funds. If you need assistance, contact your church or the Calvin Crest office (calvincrest@calvincrest.org or 1-877-795-7635). With this, we ask those who are able, to consider making a tax deductible donation to the scholarship fund along with your payment.

Refunds and Other Fees

A \$50.00 non-refundable deposit per camp secures the registration. This deposit MUST accompany the registration. Churches paying the deposit must include the deposit with the registration form. Fifty percent of the camper fee is due 14 days prior to the start of the event. The remaining balance is due at registration. Upon cancellation within 10 days of camp, fees will be refunded only if the camper slot can be filled. Camper "no shows" will be billed 100% of camper fees. There is a \$25.00 fee charged for returned checks.

Homesickness

Preparing campers for the week: Prepare campers ahead of camp for the best possible experience. Let them know your expectations for them and focus on positive aspects of camp such as making new friends, doing fun activities and growing closer to God. Have your child help pack their bags. This will give them a chance to know what they've packed and where to find things. If your child is nervous about the camp experience schedule a tour of Calvin Crest beforehand by calling the office. Do not promise that you will pick them up if they are homesick. Instead, focus on how proud of them you will be when they come home.

Things to do during the week of camp: Write letters to your child emphasizing the fun they are having at Camp. Let them know that everything is going well at home. This provides a sense of continuity for the child.

What Calvin Crest does for homesick campers: The Calvin Crest staff receive substantial training in how to assist homesick campers deal with their feelings. Each child is unique so there is no set procedure, but the following things are often employed. Camp staff are vigilant for campers that might be showing signs of homesickness. Staff will spend extra time with these campers and make every effort to get them involved in the fun activities happening at camp. If these efforts are not successful, the program director becomes involved. Occasionally a phone call home allows the parent to reassure their child that they can have a great experience at camp. Due to camp policy regarding electronics, campers may not have cell phones. If the program director deems a call home is prudent, the camper will use a camp phone to make the call. Our hope is that each camper remains at camp to experience the full benefit. However, the reality is that an occasional child is not ready to be here. We work with parents on how to resolve the situation well.
