

## **OAKRIDGE PROGRAM GROUP**

### **DRESS CODE & CELL PHONE POLICY**

Groups participating in Oakridge program events should fully communicate the dress code to students **before they pack** and arrive at camp. These guidelines are for Oakridge-led program events such as our overnight program camps, day camp, and winter camp.

#### **Dress Code**

While at camp, we ask students and adults to:

- Wear longer shorts (fingertip length or a 3.5-inch inseam). Do not wear pants or shorts with lettering on the bottom. Undergarments must always be fully covered.
- Not wear shirts that are low cut or have spaghetti straps, open backs or excessive armpit cutouts which expose torso, any cleavage or undergarments (except for sleep wear). Sleeveless shirts (that extend to shoulder seam) and tank tops (with straps at least 3 inches) are allowed during day-time activities. Large t-shirts that cover shorts should not be worn. Midriffs should always be covered (no crop tops that show skin).
- Wear shoes at all times while outdoors except for water activities. For team games and most recreation, wear closed-toe and closed-heel shoes.

#### **Swimwear**

- Males should wear swim trunks that are not tight fitting. No speedos or shorter swimsuits.
- Females should wear modest, one-piece bathing suits or tankini two-piece that provide adequate coverage of bottoms and cleavage, or wear a dark colored t-shirt over swimsuits.
- Cover ups (shirts with swim trunks for males, long covering over swimsuits for females) must be worn walking to and from water activities.
- Group leaders should help their campers follow the dress code. T-shirts may be requested if needed.

Make sure no one packs anything that:

- Advertises alcohol, tobacco, or drugs; or has inappropriate language.
- Explicitly or implicitly refers to sexual actions or situations or promotes racism, sexism, or hatred of any group or person.

**NOTE:** Adult leaders have the responsibility of modeling and monitoring their group to ensure students are dressing appropriately; and should be open to input from other group leaders and Oakridge management.

#### **Cell Phone Policy**

We strongly encourage campers to eliminate or minimize cell phone usage. Cellphones may be taken away at group leader's or Oakridge leader's discretion. We want to encourage friendship, Christian discipleship, and outdoor experiences! Our staff are not responsible for monitoring personal electronic usage or keeping track of devices. There is a zero tolerance policy for 1) viewing inappropriate images/videos at camp; 2) media that contains profanity; 3) using cell phones to receive or send content that is sexual or bullies any person.
