

Heartland Camp COVID-19 Protocols

Participants will be divided into 2 groups:

- **Staff**
- **Campers**
 - Staff residing in cabins will be considered as campers
 - Cabins will be at reduced capacity
 - i) Alternating top and bottom bunk
 - ii) Alternating head to toe
 - iii) HEPA filters in use

Distance Requirements:

- At least 3 feet between all campers
- At least 6 feet while eating and drinking without a mask indoors, including among people within the same group
- At least 6 feet between campers and staff
- At least 6 feet between staff

Mask Requirements:

- Masks will be worn during check-in at the camp entrance
 - Only necessary staff will be present
 - Traveling parties will be asked to stay at their vehicle until their turn to check-in
 - After check-in traveling parties may accompany campers onto the camp grounds with the following guidelines
 - Maintain 6 feet distance from those not part of their traveling party
 - Wear masks when indoors
 - Do NOT enter cabins
- Kitchen staff will wear masks and gloves during food service
- Campers and staff will wear masks during indoor activities where conditions dictate
 - Activities will be held outdoors when possible
- Campers and staff will wear masks in the Mini-Camp room when age appropriate and not sleeping
- Masks are not required in cabins for assigned residents
- Masks will be worn during check-out at the camp entrance
 - Traveling parties will meet campers at the camp entrance

Physical Arrangements

- Dining Hall
 - Seating will be distanced
 - Staff meals will be outdoors or delayed indoors if necessary
- Chapel
 - Seating will be distanced
 - Staff seating may be in side rooms if needed

- Camp Store Pavilion
 - Picnic tables will be marked to limit 3 per table
- Cabins
 - Only residents assigned to a cabin may enter that cabin except in an emergency or approved exception
- Extra cleaning of door knobs and restrooms
- Frequent hand washing and sanitizing

Symptoms

- Anyone arriving with COVID-19 symptoms will not be admitted
- Anyone who traveled with a person with COVID-19 symptoms will not be admitted
- Anyone showing COVID-19 symptoms while at camp will be isolated until they can return home
 - Parents/guardians need to have a designated person available to pick up campers within a few hours if they must return home
