1:30-4:30/5:30pm: On the whale watch. All trips are 3-4 hours long.

4:30-5:30pm: Camper pick-up at Cape Ann Whale Watch

## What to bring:

- Sweater or jacket. Even on a warm day, it is always 10-20 degrees cooler out on the water and will be more windy.
- Wear sneakers or rubber soled shoes.
- Sunglasses. Polarized sunglasses are the best for whale watching because they
  reduce the glare and help you see into the water better—thus seeing the whales
  better.
- Hat and Sunscreen. Sunscreen will **not** be provided to campers, they must bring their own.

## Pick-up:

On this day parents/guardians or other authorized adults will pick up their camper from Cape Ann Whale Watch **not** from the Ocean Alliance. Campers will be ready for pick-up between 4:45pm-5:30pm depending on when the boat arrives back to shore. Campers need to be officially signed out with Program Staff.
