

Camp Peniel 2026 Summer Theme: All Creation Sings

This summer the campers will be diving into our theme “All Creation Sings,” a theme that tackles both the appreciation of creation, and our response to our Creator through worship. Our theme verse this year comes from Psalm 150:6, "Let everything that breathes sing praises to the Lord!"

God created everything we see around us, and He has woven care into every part of His creation. He’s also entrusted us with the responsibility to care for what He’s made; whether that’s the world around us, the people beside us, or even our relationship with Him through worship. Throughout each week this summer, we’ll explore different stories in Scripture that reveal how the Lord cares for His creation and how He calls us to do the same. Because He cares so deeply for all He has made, every part of creation sings His praise.

As campers walk through this theme together, our hope and prayer is that they begin to notice the beauty of what the Lord has crafted; from the environment around us to the neighbor next door. Everything on earth was formed by the Lord Himself. When we care for His creation, just as He has done from the very beginning, we join in on the chorus of a beautiful symphony sung by all of His creation.

On Monday, campers will learn how God created everything from nothing by His word. Creation shows His power, wisdom, and intentionality. We are not accidents, we are created with purpose. This foundation of faith shapes how we see the world and ourselves.

Tuesday we’ll dive into how God gave humans the responsibility to care for His creation. We are stewards, not owners. Taking care of the earth honors God, who entrusted it to us. This includes small everyday actions and big-picture thinking.

On Wednesday we’ll take a look at how God’s greatest act of caring for creation was sending Jesus to redeem it. While sin broke creation, God’s love restores it. The gospel shows us how far He goes to care for His people and all He has made.

Thursday campers will learn that caring for creation includes caring for the people made in God’s image. Jesus calls us to love God first, and then to love others as ourselves. Loving our neighbor is not just about feelings but action, helping those in need.

And then Friday we’ll wrap up the week with how worship is our response to God as Creator and Lord. He deserves all glory because He made everything and sustains it. Worship is not just singing, but living lives that reflect His worth.
