<u>For Explorers and Discovery Programs:</u> framed backpack with padded straps and a hip belt (borrow a pack or contact the registrar to secure use of a camp backpack), day backpack, mess kit (cup, bowl, plate, and utensils in a ziplock bag are fine), backpacking type tent (optional)

<u>For Caving:</u> one additional long sleeve shirt or sweatshirt, pants (no holes in the knees and no sweatpants), shoes with tread that can get muddy, headlamp or small flashlight with extra batteries – caving clothes may get muddy and might not be usable for other camp activities

<u>For Canoeing</u>: water shoes or old sneakers that can get wet (no flip-flops or slides which will fall off in the river)

<u>For Paintball:</u> Recommended but not required: camouflage or green/brown/black pants and long sleeve shirt, personal paintball equipment is permitted

For Marksmanship: Bring up to \$20 for the gift shop at the firearms museum

For Mountain Biking: Bring your own bike, helmet, water bottle. Optional: elbow and knee pads

What Not to Bring:

- Cell phone
- Hand-held electronic games
- Music player

- Alcohol
- Tobacco
- Knives (other than pocket type)

Digital Detox:

Phone Policy:

There is no cell phone reception at camp. There is a primary phone line for camp business and emergency use by the staff.

Mail Call:

Mail call is a fun part of lunch each day. We recommend 2-3 pieces of mail. The first should be sent 2-3 days prior to the first day of camp or dropped off at the Wardensville Post Office when driving through town. Camp tradition calls for anyone receiving three or more pieces of mail in one day to run around the dining hall. It's fun, but please don't overload your child. Information will be sent about how to send emails to your child.

"Do's & Don'ts" of Letters:

When you write your son, ask him what he is doing and tell him what you are doing. Refrain from statements like, "I miss you so much," "I can't wait 'till you're home," or "The dog sure misses you." As well-meant as these statements are, they can cause a camper who may be prone to homesickness to feel some symptoms.
