Junior Flight School




Materials and Mechanics

JULY 29-AUGUST 2

Ever wondered how airplane parts fit together or what it takes to build an aircraft that can stand up to the speed of sound? Spend this week learning about all the design and construction that happens before planes ever take to the sky. From the tools used to build aircraft to the innovative technologies and materials being used to build the future of air and space travel, take a peek behind the scenes of aerospace engineering. Meet with experts, complete engineering challenges, and go on a field trip to see some fabrication in action!

ACE Youth Volunteers

High School Students entering 10th grade and 11th grade interested in volunteering with Aerospace Camp Experience (ACE) during the summer may apply through the <u>Museum's Volunteer Program</u> beginning in mid-April for placement in ACE 2024 programs.

Before & After Care

Fees & Payment

Deposit

A non-refundable \$100.00 deposit is due at time of registration.

Payment Schedule

Full registration payment is due by June 3rd. Campers with outstanding payments will not be admitted to ACE until payment is made in full.

Refunds & Cancellations

Registrations that are canceled three weeks prior to the start of a camp session are refundable, minus the \$100.00 non-refundable deposit. Registrations canceled within three weeks of the start of a camp session are non-refundable.

ACE Financial Assistance Program

To support The Museum of Flight's ongoing commitment to accessibility, participants who experience financial barriers to enrolling in ACE can submit an application and register through our Access Program.

Full and Partial Access Camperships are available for ACE attendance. Applications are reviewed in the order they are received. Funds are limited.

Application can be completed during registration or by emailing the ACE office at <u>ACE@museumofflight.org</u>. ACE Staff will notify participants of acceptance by Monday, June 3, 2024.

Partial Access Campership

\$100 will cover one week of Camp, including Before & After Care fees. \$56.00 deposit due at time of registration.*

Full Access Campership

ACE will fully cover one week of Camp, plus Before & After Care fees. \$6.00 administrative fee due at time of registration.*

Connections Membership

Sick Camper Policy

For the safety of campers and staff, we request that any camper who feels ill or is exhibiting any of the below symptoms stay home from camp. If a camper begins to feel ill during the camp day and presents any of the below symptoms, parent(s), caregiver(s) or guardian(s) may be asked to pick their camper up:

- Fever
- Cough
- Headache
- Sore throat
- Nausea
- Fatigue
- Shortness of breath
- New loss of taste or smell
- Congestion

ACE sick policies and procedures may change based on updated local, state and federal guidance and health recommendations. Any changes will be posted online and registrants will be notified.

ACE is a mask-friendly program and masks are available for participant and staff use. ACE masking policies may change based on local, state and federal guidance and health recommendations.

Vaccinations

The Museum of Flight requires all campers have up-to-date vaccinations or allowable exemptions as required by Washington State law for school attendance, as such we are collecting camper immunization status. Additionally, The Museum of Flight highly encourages all campers be vaccinated against COVID-19. We continue to monitor local, state, and federal guidance and health recommendations and reserve the right to update or change health and safety requirements for camp participation at any time.
