✓ I can ask for help!

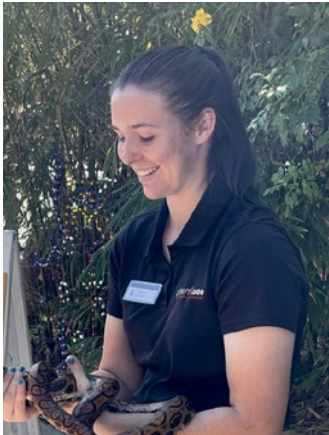
