- Shorts & Jeans/Long Pants
- Seasonal Shirts/T-Shirts/Blouses/Modest Tank Tops
- Socks & Underwear
- Pajamas
- Comfortable Walking Shoes (closed toes)
- Sweatshirt/Fleece Jacket
- Water Resistant Jacket (suggested)

## Sherwood Name

You may decide to choose a special Sherwood name before coming to camp, or our Fine Feathered Friends will help you think of one when you arrive! Your Sherwood name is a fun phrase that includes your name instead of the actual words.

Some examples are:

The name Melissa might become: "MELISSAmerica" (Miss America)

The name Ryan might become: "RYANoceros" (Rhinoceros)

The name Emily might become: "M&EMILY" (M&M)

The name Luke might become: "LUKE out below!" (Look out below!)

## Sherwood Tunic

The merry men and maids of Sherwood Forest wore green tunics because they wanted to blend into the trees in case the Sheriff walked by. You can bring your own tunic when you come live with us in Sherwood Forest! We provide a hat, belt, and feather. If you are unable to provide your own tunic, there are tunics available at camp.

To make your own tunic, we recommend using cotton broadcloth that is forest green or kelly green in color. Each tunic should be about 44 inches long and 18 inches wide (adjust accordingly as needed for your camper).

### How to make your own tunic:

Fold the fabric in half and cut a T-shaped opening for your head and neck.

Pinking shears will prevent unraveling, or you can sew the edges, if desired.

Create a collar by sewing the flaps to the tunic or by using iron-on adhesive tape or fabric glue.

You can also sew the sides of the tunic, if desired, leaving space for your arms at the top.

Decorate if desired with puff paint, markers, embroidery, iron-on patches, etc.
