

LAKE JAMES CHRISTIAN CAMP'S DRESS CODE

LJCC's intention behind creating a dress code is to encourage a focus on Jesus while at camp. We encourage our campers, faculty, and staff to dress in a way that expresses themselves while also keeping the focus on the fun, knowledge gained, and worship experienced at a session of camp. See the descriptions and images of appropriate attire for summer camp. The dean is the final authority in matters of dress.

The following guidelines apply to both male and female:

1. Avoid clothing that is too short or revealing.
 - o Tank top must be over 3 finger widths wide
 - o Undergarments, such as boxers/briefs or bras/straps, should not be visible. Shirts that are tied, ripped, or cut must not show undergarments or the areas of skin around undergarments
 - o Shirts are not to be low cut, show the midriff, or show an open back. Clothing like tube tops or halter tops is not to be worn. Sleeveless shirts (including "cut-off" tees or tank tops) need to fit to the underarm
 - o If leggings are worn, a shirt or sweater that is long enough to cover the behind must be worn
 - o All pants and shorts are to be worn at the waist, without holes above the mid-thigh
 - o All shorts/swim trunks must come to mid-thigh. This rule includes dresses as well
2. Shirts, shoes/footwear, and pants must be worn at all times. The only exception is swim time or a water activity where swimsuits are worn.
3. Apparel that advertises controlled substances, such as alcohol, tobacco, or drugs, uses profanity, promotes a non-Christian message, or is in any way sexually suggestive is forbidden, and the individual will be required to change.
4. Swimsuits
 - o Swimsuits are not to be low cut, show the midriff, or have a plunging neckline
 - o Bikinis or revealing two-piece suits are not allowed. Speedos or tight-fitting swim trunks are not allowed. Sheer swimsuits are not allowed. Tankinis are allowed as long as there is fabric covering the abdomen.
 - o Swimsuits are not to be worn during non-swimming activities. The only exceptions are during special activities that require a swimsuit.
 - o All campers and guests are to wear a cover-up (t-shirt or dress) down to the beachfront. Boys must wear a shirt to and from the beach front
