


Day Camp (D/B/J) \$350

Day Camp (J) \$375




Outdoor Chefs



Overnight Camp (C/S/A) \$800



Overnight Camp (J) \$725




High Adventure Overnight Programs

July 19-24



Cost: \$900

Become the ultimate mariner! As part of this program, campers will conquer the water both on and off camp. Girl Scouts will spend three days and two nights at Mystic Seaport Museum, including sleeping below decks on the historic 1880s Joseph Conrad vessel. Working together as crews, campers will explore maritime history, ocean science, and life on the Mystic River through hands-on activities such as dip netting, team-building challenges, rowing, and a rigging climb. The experience also includes stargazing in the planetarium and a nautical movie night! When not at the Mystic Seaport Museum, Girl Scouts will continue the adventure with a sailing field trip, boating, and more back at camp.

Get ready to hit the trails on and off camp! As Trailblazers campers will hike on local trails and learn outdoor skills before venturing off on a two night beginner backpacking trip. 

How to Register

To reserve your camper's spot today, go to www.gssne.org and register online. At the time of registration, a \$35 non-refundable deposit or the full balance is due.

All final payments are due by the listed registration deadline (2 weeks prior) for each session. GSSNE reserves the right to cancel any registration not paid in full by the advertised registration deadline.

If you register after the registration deadline, all fees are to be paid in full upon registration.

Campers not currently registered as a Girl Scout or are a new Girl Scout are required to become a member at the Membership fee of \$55. This GSUSA membership is valid through September 30, 2026.

Cancellations, Refunds, and Transfers

Cancellation and refund requests must be submitted and received by the GSSNE Office by the programs registration deadline. Until the registration deadline, a full refund less the \$35 deposit per person will be granted.

In the event of GSSNE canceling a camp program, families will be contacted to discuss a transfer to another program, or to receive a refund.

In all other circumstances, any monies paid (less the nonrefundable deposit) will be refunded only if:

- The camper is placed on a waitlist or if the financial assistance amount requested is not fully granted
- The camper cannot attend due to illness or injury. A letter from a physician must accompany a written request for refund.
- The camper is sent home from camp due to illness or injury. Refunds are prorated in such cases and will be made only at the written request of the parent/guardian

Please note that a refund will not be given if the camper leaves early for any other reason (including homesickness). Refunds will also not be issued due to inclement weather.

A \$15 transfer fee will be applied to a campers registration balance each time a change is made to a campers session, program, or camp (unless the change is requested by GSSNE due to program cancellation)

Financial Aid

At Girl Scouts, we believe that camp is for every girl. We are pleased to be able to offer financial assistance to allow more girls to experience Girl Scout Camp. To apply, complete the Financial Assistance Application and register online to make your deposit.

Please Note: You must register online before your Financial Assistance Application will be processed. Notification of financial assistance granted will be made within three weeks of submission. If financial assistance is requested, Summer Camp Cookie Credits will be applied first.

The deadline to submit the Financial Assistance Application is the registration deadline for the chosen camp program.

Summer Camp Cookie Credits

Girl Scout Cookies can power an amazing adventure! Girls participating in the GSSNE Cookie Program earn Camp Cookie Credits, which may then be applied to the cost of a GSSNE Day Camp Program, Overnight Camp Program. Girls in troops who choose Older Girl Proceeds do not earn Camp Cookie Credits. Credits may be pooled by sisters in the same family. Summer Camp Cookie Credits cannot be transferred outside of families and can only be applied to GSSNE Summer Camp. Camp Cookie Credits expire on September 30, 2026, and cannot be used for troop camping.

If a camper is experiencing any cold or flu-like symptoms they will not be permitted to attend camp unless a doctors note is provided. If a camper becomes ill or injured, or if any other concerns arise while at camp, parents/guardians may be asked to pick up camper and have them evaluated by a health care professional.

Behavioral, Medical, and Dietary Concerns and Restrictions:

If there are any behavioral (ADHD/ADD, ASD, etc.), medical (including mental health), or dietary concerns for your registered camper, a parent/guardian should contact the Camp Director at least 2 weeks prior to the camp session starting. If your child requires support in school, special treatments, injections, is immune compromised, has mobility limitations (i.e. cast, crutches, or wheelchair) or any other special issues please contact customercare@gssne.org to discuss a potential support plan with a staff member. Some scenarios will require a doctor's note.

Behavior Agreement:

At GSSNE, we strive to create a caring and supportive community. We want all participants to feel safe, welcomed, and accepted. Following and abiding by the rules and guidelines ensures a memorable experience for all. Campers are expected to respect themselves and others. Inappropriate behavior negatively affects everyone and can compromise safety. Since the experience at camp passes quickly we try to deal with behavior by setting clear expectations. Everyone will hear the rules which include: respect the staff and respect others in the group. In addition to these rules, many groups create their own group contract, which outlines the behavior expected by group members. The group creates this themselves and signs their name acknowledging that they will abide by their contract. If a participant breaks the rules, a staff member will speak with the participant and work with them to correct their behavior. We use a series of consequences for any behavior that has gone beyond acceptable limits. This consequence structure, combined with positive reinforcement, is designed to put behavior decisions in the child's hands. It is meant to give a camper plenty of chances to make good decisions. The goal is to change negative behavior in order to prevent anyone from not being able to participate in camp activities. If a camper is excused from camp based on behavior a parent/guardian or other authorized adult is required to pick up their camper within a 2-hour time frame.
