BEFORE YOU COME:

- *Registration Balance:* Winter Camp registration entails a \$175 fee per camper, to be paid before camp begins!
- Media Release: By participating in camp programs, permission is granted for Camp Tekakwitha to use photos, videos, and images taken of guests for purposes which Camp Tekakwitha deems appropriate.
- Health Forms: These forms gather any necessary information regarding your camper's health and medical information. Please have the forms completed on Ultra camp before Winter Camp begins!

TRADING POST (CAMP STORE)

Campers may purchase snacks (i.e. soda, ice cream, candy bars; priced at \$0.50 to \$2.50 per item) and miscellaneous souvenirs (i.e. t-shirts, hats, sunglasses, stuffed animals, sweatshirts; priced at \$0.50 to \$30.00+ per item). Camper money can be deposited on Friday during check-in (with cash, check, or credit card) and then campers receive their individual card each day with the available balance to spend. PROHIBITED ITEMS

- □ Personal sporting equipment—i.e. shooting sports equipment, archery equipment, etc.
- □ Inappropriate or offensive clothing
- □ Drones

If our staff suspects anyone is in possession of an item we deem inappropriate, the camp staff holds the right to confiscate the items and/or dismiss the owner from the property. Camp cannot be held responsible for the loss or damage of any personal items.

LOST-N-FOUND

We will hold lost-n-found items for several weeks and will make every effort to return a lost item if you contact us. Please note: we do our best to return all lost articles, but we cannot assume the responsibility for lost or damaged property.

MEALS

Camp Tekakwitha serves delicious family-style meals designed for the average diet. If there is a need for special dietary accommodations, please complete your health forms and reach out to us at least 2 weeks ahead of winter camp weekend.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

At least one certified nurse is on-site during our winter camp weekend, serving to administer medications and ensure camper safety throughout the fun. Our Camp Tekakwitha staff members are also certified in emergency first aid and CPR, and there is an AED located in the main lodge office area.

Camp Tekakwitha visits the nearby Theda Care hospital or Prevea clinic in Shawano in the event of an injury or need for further medical service. Additionally, we are served by the Shawano County 911 system with a quick response time by first responders and paramedic ambulance.

In order to maintain the health, safety, and quality of our camp and our campers' experience, Camp Tekakwitha staff reserves the right to deny entry, restrict or deny use of facilities and programs, or remove from the property any person whose behavior they deem inappropriate or may present a risk.
