Volunteer & Service-Learning Guidelines

1. Safety is our number one rule. Stick together, stay with the group.
2. The greatest gift that you can give anyone is a smile and a warm spirit of friendship.
"Every time you smile at someone, it is an action of love,
a gift to that person, a beautiful thing."

3. Volunteer in a spirit of **humility** and with a genuine desire to meet and talk with the local people.
4. *Be aware of the feelings of other people*, thus preventing what might be offensive behavior.
5. Cultivate the habit of *listening* and *observing*, rather than merely hearing and seeing.
6. **Keep cell phones OFF at devotions, service work, meals, group meetings, etc., even in the vans.**
7. Realize that people in the community you visit often have time concepts and thought patterns different from your own. *Not inferior, just different.*
8. Discover the *enrichment* that comes from seeing another way of life . . .
9. Cultivate the habit of asking question instead of *knowing all the answers*
10. Remember that you may be one of many volunteers. *Do not expect special privileges.*
11. Reflect on your experiences; seek to deepen your understanding. "What enriches you may rob or violate others."
12. Give 110%. Be respectful of the property of the school or agency. Make each place look better than before you arrived.
