What to Bring To Camp

Sleeping Bag & Pillow

Clothes for an active week that includes indoor and outdoor recreation and class time. Be prepared for warm to hot weather.

Jacket for cool evenings or possibly rain

Shoes (closed toed) and sandals

Modest Swimsuit and towel

Toiletries: towel, washcloth, soap, shampoo, deodorant, toothbrush & tooth paste, etc.

Bible, notebook, pen, flashlight, camera (optional)

A friend

Cell Phones are permitted for use as camera (airplane mode) during free time, or for emergencies

Personal sports equipment is the responsibility of each person & must be approved by Ross Point Administration

Items not to bring:

iPods, Gameboys, MP3 Players, televisions, alcohol, knives, tobacco, illegal drugs, pets, fireworks or firearms.

Registration:

Campers should plan to arrive no earlier than 2:00 pm on the first day of camp. Registration is from 2:00-4:00 pm. Camp will close at 2:00 PM on the last day of camp. For camper safety, campers may NOT be picked up early unless prior arrangements are made.

Remember, you can earn an additional \$5.00 discount from your camp fee for every new camper you bring.

Camp Store

Campers have an opportunity at least once daily to purchase souvenir or snack items at the camp store. Canteen money is "banked" at registration for each camper and the balance is refunded the last day of camp.

Camp Mail:

We encourage sending letters and postcards to campers. We ask that you do not send any special packages (especially food items). Letters should be sent at least 2 days before the end of camp.

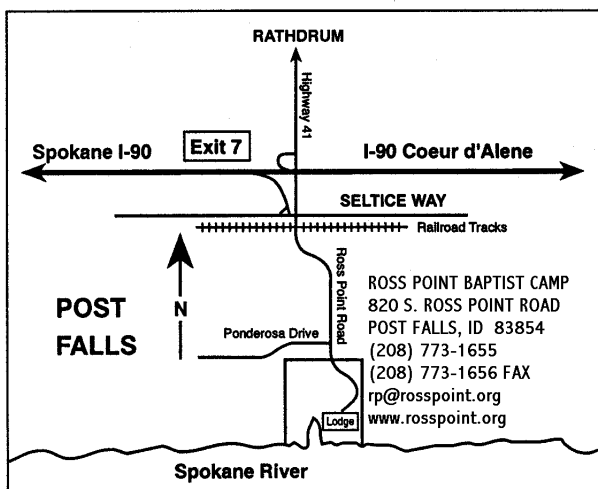

From the west, take exit 7 and stay in the middle lane. At the light at Sellice, turn left (east) and stay in the right hand lane. Turn right at the first light, which is Hwy 41 north and Ross Point Rd going south. After 3/4 mile, the road turns to the left and in that turn, the camp entrance is on the right. Follow the paved road for 1/4 mile to the main parking area.

From the east, take exit 7 and stay in the right hand lane. Turn right (south) at the light on Hwy 41. Go through the intersection at Sellice and continue on Ross Point Road. After 3/4 mile, the road turns to the

Health Information:

A Health Care Provider (HCP) will be available to care for illness and accidents. We have excellent emergency services within 5 minutes and Kootenai Medical Center is only 7 miles away in Coeur d'Alene. All medications, prescription and over-the-counter, must be in their original containers and be turned into the HCP at registration. The HCP will secure the medications and have campers take them at prescribed times. Ross Point provides over-the-counter drugs like

Tylenol, cough drops, Maalox, etc. for campers as necessary according to physician approved protocols, so please don't send any of these OTC medications with campers unless they have a signed doctor's order.
