What to Bring To Camp

Sleeping Bag & Pillow

Clothes for an active week that includes indoor and outdoor recreation and class time. Be prepared for warm to hot weather. Jacket for cool evenings or possibly rain

Shoes (closed toe are a must for challenge course activities) and sandals

Modest Swimsuit and towel

Toiletries: towel, washcloth, soap, shampoo, deodorant, toothbrush & tooth paste, etc.

Water bottle with name on it
Bible, notebook, pen, flashlight, camera, small personal sized hand sanitizer, a friend

Personal sports equipment is the responsibility of each person & must be approved by Ross Point

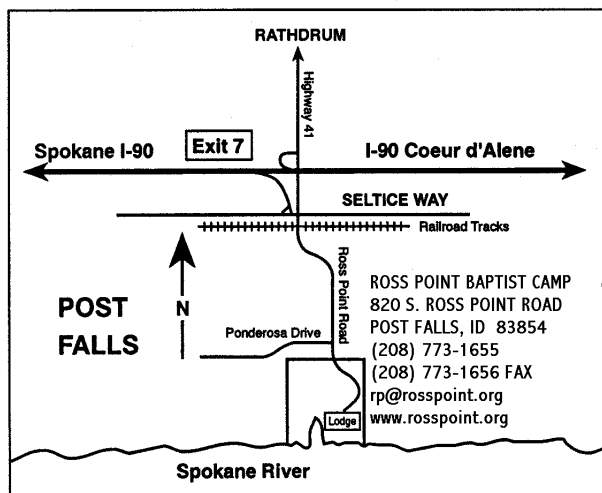


Items not to bring:

A goal at Ross Point is to have each camper fully engage in the camp community enhancing social skills including empathy, free from outside distractions. Do not bring any electronics, including cell phones, iPods, televisions, or alcohol, knives, tobacco, illegal drugs, pets, fireworks or weapons.

Each camper will receive a camp T-shirt and camp memory book. Unless otherwise requested by a parent, Ross Point reserves the right to use photographs of campers for publicity purposes.

Directions To Ross Point



From the west, take exit 7 and stay in the middle lane. At the light at Selstice, turn left (east) and stay in the right hand lane. Turn right at the first light, which is Hwy 41 north and Ross Point Rd going south. After 3/4 mile, the road turns to the left and in that turn, the camp entrance is on the right. Follow the paved road for 1/4 mile to the main parking area.

From the east, take exit 7 and stay in the right hand lane. Turn right (south) at the light on Hwy 41. Go through the intersection at Selstice and continue on Ross Point Road. After 3/4 mile, the road turns to the left and in that turn, the camp entrance is on the right. Follow the paved road for 1/4 mile to the main parking area.

Registration:

Campers should plan to arrive no earlier than 2:00 pm on the first day of camp. Registration is from 2:00-3:00 for A-K 3:15-4:15 L-Z. Camp will close at 2:00 PM on the last day of camp. For camper safety, campers may NOT be picked up early unless prior arrangements are made. The office will call and verify any late arrivals or no-shows.

Camp Store

Campers have an opportunity at least once daily to purchase souvenir or snack items at the camp store. Canteen money is "banked" at registration for each camper and the balance is refunded the last day of camp.

Camp Mail:

We encourage sending letters and postcards to campers. We ask that you do not send any special packages (especially food items). Letters should be sent at least 2 days before the end of camp.

Health Information:

A Health Care Provider (HCP) will be available to care for illness and accidents. We have excellent emergency services within 5 minutes and Kootenai Medical Center is only 7 miles away in Coeur d'Alene. All medications, prescription and over-the-counter, must be in their original containers and be turned into the HCP at registration. The HCP will secure the medications and have campers take them at prescribed times. Ross Point provides over-the-counter drugs like Tylenol, cough drops, Maalox, etc. for campers as necessary according to physician approved protocols, so please don't send any of these OTC medications with campers unless they have a signed doctor's order.

Ross Point Camp is a non-medical facility. We provide standard first aid and healthcare according to these policies and procedures. Campers who require substantial regular ongoing medical care may need to provide their own personal healthcare provider in order to attend. Contact the office for determination. Emergency treatment will be administered according to Red Cross First Aid guidelines, prior to transport to a hospital or urgent care facility. Parents will be notified by the Executive Director of Ross Point Camp as soon as possible regarding any camper with the following:

- illness that lasts more than 24 hours or prevents your camper from rejoining the group within 24 hours
- a fever over 103 degrees F or a persistent fever over 101 degrees F
- an infectious, communicable illness
- an injury that requires medical care outside of camp
- an injury or illness that might exacerbate an existing condition
- frequent enuresis (bedwetting)
- any previous request by you

The parents will be notified and/or camper sent home. All such decisions will be made in conjunction with the Executive Director.
