Divestment from Fossil Fuels – Meighan Pritchard

There's been a lot of talk about divestment from fossil fuels, and a resolution about this passed at General Synod in 2013. How do we actually do it? What impact does it have? Come find out!

Breaking up is Hard to Do – Committee on Ministry

A talk on the new policy for concluding pastorates in the PNC-UCC. Pastors (whether in churches or chaplaincy settings) are present when we are at our most vulnerable. This makes the ending of a pastoral relationship especially difficult – or just plain hard to do. Let's talk about why this policy exists, and better understand how it has the potential for making breaking up a bit easier.

We'll have an opportunity to support this resolution, which will be voted on in our 2015 General Synod. The actions proposed by this Resolution are similar to those exercised by church bodies, as a non-violent response to apartheid in South Africa.
