

# ECC PARENT/GUARDIAN INFORMATION PACKET Children's Camp

Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s),

We are delighted to welcome your camper to ECC this summer! We will do everything we can to ensure that they experience new relationships, fun, and personal growth during their time here. The following information will help you to prepare for camp and know what to expect! If you have any questions, please feel free to call our camp office at 401-568-4055.

# Please label camper's clothing/items to ensure it's safe return!

#### **CAMP REGISTRATION:**

- Registration takes place Monday between 3:30pm and 5:30pm.
  - o If you arrive early, you will be asked to wait until 3:30pm to get into the camp.
  - Please arrive no later than 5:15pm so we can help get your camper settled in the cabin before our introductory activities at 5:30pm.
- When you arrive:
  - Leave your bags in the car
  - o Bring all medications with you to be given to the Nurse
- A lice check and brief health screening will take place as part of the registration process.
- You'll be able to drive to the cabin to drop off bags after registration is complete.

# **CAMP FEES:**

- To expedite the registration process, please pay all camp fees prior to your arrival at camp.
- If you need scholarship assistance, please call Sara at 401-568-4055 before registration day.

# **END OF CAMP:**

- Camp ends with a closing ceremony on **Friday at 4:00pm**.
- Families and friends are encouraged to join us for that service.
- Campers will be released to their parent/quardian/designated adult at the close of the service.

#### **FORMS:**

- All online forms must be completed prior to registration day.
- To speed up check-in please e-mail, mail, or fax (401) 568-7805 us a copy of your camper's most recent physical to the office prior to the start of camp.

# **MEDICATION AT CAMP:**

- All over the counter and prescription medication brought to ECC must be administered by our camp nurses.
- All medication must be checked in with our Nurses during registration in the original packaging with prescription information included on the container.

# PARENT/GUARDIAN NOTIFICATION:

- If we have a concern about a camper's health, we will immediately attempt to make phone contact with the camper's parent/guardian or emergency contact.
- Instances where we will call include repeated need for over-the-counter meds, signs of infection or illness, or obvious need for immediate medical treatment.
- We will also notify parents/guardians if we are having repeated behavior issues, or if one of our core camp rules has been broken
- Parents/guardians may alert the camp if there are other circumstances under which they would like to be notified.

#### **CAMP RULES ARE AS FOLLOWS:**

- Respect must be shown for everyone on the property.
- Drugs, alcohol, and weapons are not permitted. If one of these items is found on a camper it will be confiscated and parents/quardians will be called.
- Sexual activity is not permitted.
- Physical violence of any kind is not permitted.
- Bullying is not permitted.

Cell phone use is not permitted and will result in confiscation until the camp session is over.

# MAIL:

We encourage sending your camper mail, it will be delivered by their counselors daily.

# STORE, SPENDING MONEY AND PERSONAL EQUIPMENT:

- Campers visit the store once per day (included in camp fee) so spending money is not necessary. Other camp store items may be purchased during registration or after the closing service.
- Campers are discouraged from bringing personal sports equipment/ valued belongings that may be lost or damaged.

### **CELL PHONES AND ELECTRONICS:**

- Cell phones/electronics are not allowed at camp.
- We encourage bringing a camera if your camper wants to document their camp experience with photos.

#### IN CASE OF EMERGENCY:

- If you need to reach the camp staff or get a message to your camper, please call the camp phone at 401-568-4055.
- The director's cell phone is 401-473-8718 in case of extreme emergency.
