ABOUT THE RALLIES

The doors will open 30 minutes prior to the beginning of each rally with pre-rally videos on the big screen. Be sure to sit in your assigned seats. There is no need to save seats. Assigned seats are for the entire weekend.

ABOUT THE HOTELS

The Duluth area hotels have seen many conferences come and go and they have seen some great groups and some not so good groups. Please remember that these hotels and motels will have other guests staying over the weekend along with us, and we are representing Christ to all of these people. Please be courteous and obey the following hotel and motel guidelines below.

(Youth workers: Please review with your group Friday evening.)

- Be in your hotel/motel by 11:00 p.m. and in your room and quiet by 11:30 p.m.
- Never have anyone of the opposite sex in your room.
- Be sure to keep the hallways quiet between 8:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.
- Don't let your doors slam—put a towel in the door jam.
- Never leave your room open and unsupervised.

CONDUCT CODE

My model for conduct and attitudes is the Lord Jesus Christ.

I will observe all rules established by the Conference Directors and will follow the code given by my church.

For my own safety, I will not leave the rally area unless given special permission by my Youth Pastor/Leader.

I will attend all scheduled rallies and sit with my group.

To focus on Christ at the rallies, there will be no hand holding or arm around the opposite sex.

Any free time given me will be used wisely, and I will at all times respect the property and safety of others.

In hotel rooms, no members of the opposite sex are allowed.

I will (in travel to, during, and from the conference) avoid all questionable activity and things which would be offensive to Christ, my parents, my church, the rally and others.

ELECTRONICS

Electronic equipment including games, radios, iPods, computers, strobes & laser toys/lights, as well as fireworks, alcohol, narcotics, and tobacco are not allowed. (Use common sense on other questionable items.) Any of these items will be confiscated and may not be returned.

There will be a few occasions during the rallies where cell phone polls will take place, however any cell phone being used outside of that designated time during the rallies, breakout times and seminars are subject to confiscation. Cell phones should only be used for emergencies and for youth leaders to communicate and coordinate their group activities.

FRIENDLY REMINDERS

Since our hotels, rallies, service projects, food service and recreation options are at varying locations, be sure to be careful. We listed a few things that should help keep you and your group safe.

- Stay on the sidewalks and walkways. Stay off of residents' yards.
- Walk or travel in groups of 3 or more.
- No roller blades or skateboards indoors or on downtown sidewalks & streets.
- Be sure to cross city streets at the provided crosswalks. Don't go against the lights or "J" walk.
- Avoid running and loud noises inside all buildings & skyways.
- Be polite and courteous to all city residents, businesses, hotels and DECC staff.




