

Dear Parent,



We are very excited that your son or daughter will be joining us for camp this week. Below is additional information to help you plan and prepare for this camp. Please review all details, especially the drop-off and pick-up information, in preparation for Monday's start. **As a reminder, all summer camps are being held on the middle school campus, which is located at 5936 Green Rea Road 28226.**

1. Carpool: Upon reaching the entrance of the middle school campus, follow signs for carpool. You will not enter the main entrance, but rather wrap around the back of the school. A map is attached to this email as a visual aid. Please note the separate drop-off and pick-up for Camp Buccaneer on the map.

Drop-off: Summer staff will be on hand to open car doors and to bring campers to the correct location. Please do not exit your car as this is a moving carpool lane.

Pick-Up: Please print and fill out the attached carpool sign and have ready for pick up. Summer staff will assist in loading the campers so please do not exit your car. If you need to help your child buckle up, please pull forward around the bend to the Buckle Up Station to keep the carpool line flowing. We appreciate your patience during pickup carpool.

2. Extended Care and Transportation: If you registered your child for any of the extended care or transportation options, you will receive a separate email that describes the procedure for drop-off, pick-up, and transfer between camps.
3. Inclement Weather Policy: In the event of lightning in the area, a school alarm will sound, and all students will be required to remain indoors until an all-clear signal is given. In the event that the lightning alarm has sounded during dismissal, you may come to the room and personally pick up your child. This is the only way students will be allowed to leave until the all-clear signal is heard.
4. Food: During the summer, the school cafeteria is closed so lunch and snacks must be provided from home. It is suggested that campers bring a snack for each morning and afternoon session they attend, as time will be given to eat. Please do not send food that contains or may contain nuts due to campers with peanut and other tree nut allergies.
5. Medical: Country Day employs a certified athletic trainer during all summer camp hours. The trainer will handle all medical issues, including illness and injury, but cannot dispense any over the counter medication. If your child has any specific medical issues, which were not described during the registration process and are important for our summer staff to know, please contact us to describe in further detail.
6. Clothing: All campers should wear appropriate clothes that will enable them to participate in a variety of summer activities. For safety, campers should wear closed toed sneakers. Lost and found is located in the Summer Programs office.
7. T-shirts: Each camper will receive a t-shirt on the first day of camp. Campers only receive one t-shirt per summer, so if they attend multiple weeks of camp they will receive their shirt during the first week.
