Summer 2021 Updates



Campers are required to complete a 14-day precamp health screening. This screening also includes an arrival-at-camp portion for the camper and other family members who are in the car.



Campers must present a negative COVID-19 PCR test result no more than 5 days before the start of their camp session.

Rapid test results will not be accepted.



Each camper will belong to ONE cohort (cabin) which will be made of campers and camp counselors. Cohorts will be no larger than 9 at Willa-a-Way and 7 at Rutledge.



Campers must wear a mask inside communal spaces and when social distancing isn't possible.

We also ask campers to use hand sanitizer frequently.



Our Dining Hall procedures now include handwashing, clear entry/exit points, distanced tables and grab-n-go meal options.



Camp Twin Lakes will be cleaning high-touch surfaces multiple times throughout each day and disinfect program equipment between each use when possible.
