CAMPER GUIDELINES

- The Dean's schedule will prevail. 1.
- Campers are not allowed on the lake or any other "off limits" area of the camp without proper adult supervision. 2.
- 3. No one active in camp activities (camper or faculty) will be allowed to leave the grounds without permission from the Dean.
- The use of tobacco, alcohol, vape products, marijuana, or any controlled substance is forbidden on the camp grounds. Visitors must 4. adhere to this as well.
- 5. No pets, weapons, electronic devices, internet enabled devices or cell phones are allowed at camp.
- 6. Sickness or injury must be reported to the Camp First Aid Provider, regardless of how small it may be.
- 7. NO SNACKS of any kind are to be taken into the dorms or they will be confiscated.
- 8. Campers / faculty shall not ride on any camp equipment, vehicles, mowers, etc.
- 9. Shirts and shoes are to be worn at all times while on the camp grounds, except pool area.
- 10. No one shall leave the dorms at night except for emergencies.
- 11. Writing on or defacing camp buildings will not be allowed. Campers or parents will be held financially responsible for any vandalism.

Cell Phone POLICY

Camper are NOT allowed to have cell phones, IPADs, tablets, Apple watch, or any other internet enabled device at camp. (No electronics are allowed). Please understand, it is not our intent to prevent parents from communicating with their children, but cell phones can be a distraction for the camper. With photo and internet capability of the phones, a no cell phone policy protects the privacy of every child here. If parents/guardians need to reach the campers quickly, please call the office at 217-529-2625. Every effort will be made by camp staff and faculty for this to happen. The office phone is forwarded to management cell phones at night for emergency purposes.

It will be up to the Deans discretion as to how mail will be distributed daily. Please do not send food items, electronics or phones.

Please note that we are not just trying to enforce a set of rules, but we are trying to encourage a spirit of self respect and modesty.

CHECK IN DAY

For traditional residential camps: (Trailblazers, Explorers, Junior High, Niners and High School Camp). Check in will be at 3pm on the first day. (9am for First Chance and Junior Camps)

- 1. Assigned / Staggered check in times: (i.e. 3pm, 3:10, 3:15pm, etc.)
- 2. Assigned by bunk room / team campers' parents/guardians will get this information ahead of time
- 3. Parents / Guardians do not get out of cars
- 4. We will send very detailed instructions prior to drop off. Also there will be staff/ red carpet crew (RCC) directing drivers
- 5. Temp checks / waivers collected around chapel entrance
- 6. Meds dropped near bell
- 7. Campers dropped off between dorms: faculty / staff / deans/ red carpet crew greeting families/ campers.
- 8. RCC / staff helping campers take stuff to rooms.
- 9. Parents drive back out
- **10.** No parking in general drive area
- 11. HS Campers will be asked not to drive if possible as parking is limited
- 12. Once the faculty of a room has all of their campers (6-7 typically), they will take them to the pool for swim tests. (Campers will be told that this will be the only time for the swim tests. They do not have to do it, but there will not be other opportunities). Swim tests will be more involved than previous years. Swim test must be passed for access to deep end. To pass, campers will have to complete the following:
 - Jump feet first into water over the head in depth, level-off and tread water for 60 seconds.
 - Jump feet first into water, level-off and swim 2 widths of the pool in a strong manner using the following strokes. (Free-style or front crawl)
 - Reasons for not passing are: 1. Underwater swimming 2. Dog paddling 3. Resting in the middle of the test 4. Treading water and not maintaining a forward motion (in part B). 5. Swimming too fast and appearing to be too tired at the end of the test

PICK UP

For traditional residential camps: (First Chance, Trailblazers, Explorers, Juniors, Junior High, Niners and High School Camp). Camp will end at 4pm on the final day. In an effort to control traffic, no parking will be allowed. Please do not arrive early, unless you have made arrangements ahead of time to pick up PRIOR to 3pm.

- 1. STAY IN THE CAR: Follow the route indicated by staff and map
- 2. As you drive onto the grounds, you will be directed by staff to drive south towards the Bell.
- 3. Just before the Bell Circle, Your ID will be checked to make sure that you are on the approved camper pick up list.
- 4. If you must pick up meds, they will turn right at the bell. Then follow with the next step.
- 5. If you do not have meds, follow the drive towards the turn around between the dorms.
- 6. Continue to drive back to the north to the Zone already indicated to you: 1, 2. Or 3.
- 7. Pull up to the faculty / staff at that zone. (Zones will be indicated by signs).
- 8. Faculty / staff will ask for the name of the camper and double check the name on the authorized pick up list. Camper loads up and leaves.

COVID 19 Precautions

Before arrival to LSCA:

- Campers/parents will be asked to monitor their temperatures, social interactions, and general health in the two weeks leading up to camp session.
- All campers will sign a waiver regarding presence of COVID symptoms or exposure in the two weeks leading up to camp session.

Upon arrival to LSCA:

- Parents/Guardians will stay in vehicle throughout drop-off procedure.
- Temperatures will be taken of each camper at check-in by an LSCA staff member wearing gloves.
- Masks will be required by all campers, staff members, and volunteers.

Camper to Camper Interactions:

- Campers will be placed in family groups / teams based on their room assignments. Two family groups / teams will be able to participate in activities together throughout the camp session. This will be no greater than 28 other campers, abiding by the DCEO guidelines.
- At certain times when groups of 28 are gathered in one outdoor space they will be at least 30 feet apart.

- When social distancing of 6 feet cannot be maintained masks will be required.
- Masks will not be required when: eating, sleeping, participating in water activities. We will be intentional about providing activities and natural spacing to allow for less mask wearing.

General Camp COVID Precautions:

- Cleaning / sanitizing of commonly touched / utilized surfaces will be done often.
- Hand sanitizer will always be available.

In the Dorms:

- Each room will have a limited number of campers with beds appropriately spaced apart.
- Campers will only share bathrooms with other campers in their designated groups.
- When walking in the hallways wearing masks will be required.
- Bathrooms will be cleaned and disinfected twice a day.

Mealtimes:

- Designated camper groups of 28 will take turns eating meals inside / outside.
- All food / drink items from the canteen will be prepared and prepackaged based off DCEO food preparation guidelines.
- Hand sanitizer will always be available.
