
Wednesday Night Event: Crayotic Color Craze

WHAT TO BRING AND WHAT NOT TO BRING TO CAMP



What to Pack for each day:

Bring a backpack or bag with...

Medication in original containers, inside a labeled gallon ziplock bag

Bug repellent, sunscreen

Wet and dirty clothes plastic bag

Long pants for riding horses

Flip Flops (wear tennis shoes)

Swimming trunks for guys

Modest swimsuit that cover midriff for girls

Beach Towel

If you and your camper choose the overnight option, we will ask for a final decision the day before at pick-up.

WHAT TO BRING AND WHAT NOT TO BRING TO CAMP



What you can PACK for the overnight stay:

Medication in original containers, inside a labeled gallon ziplock bag

Bug repellent, sunscreen

Wet and dirty clothes bags

Long pants for riding horses

Tennis Shoes

T-shirts and shorts

Swimming trunks for guys

Modest swimsuit that cover midriff for girls

Bible

Toothbrush and toothpaste

Soap, shampoo, deodorant

Towels for showering and swimming

Sleeping bag or sheets and a blanket

Pillow and pillow case

Sleeping clothes

Sweatshirt(s)

Snacks in sealed containers only. Please avoid bringing anything containing peanuts due to potential severe allergies of cabin mates.

Please do not pack anything valuable and do not over pack. Bring old items that you will not miss if they turn up lost. Camp Carl is not responsible for lost or stolen items. Lost and found items are held only two days after camper's departure. After that, they will be donated to a local rescue shelter.

What NOT to Bring to Camp

- Any electronic device that can access the internet breaches our security policy. If discovered by a counselor, it will be collected and stored until the end of the camper's session.
- In addition, Camp Carl cannot be responsible for lost or broken articles. Please do not bring anything that would break easily or cause loss if misplaced.

- Computers iPads/Tablets
- Handheld video game systems
- Alcohol, Illegal drugs
- Tobacco products Weapons (including pocket knives and multi-tools)
- Fireworks
- Personal sports equipment (everything you need will be provided for your activities)

Drop off and pick-up at Camp Carl

- Drop off at 9am Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday (if not staying overnight Wednesday)
- Pick-up at 5pm Mon, Tue, Wed (if not staying overnight), and Thursday

Please Note: If choosing to use the shuttle service, for you child's safety, they must ride the shuttle both ways every day. The exception is Friday pick-up. Parent's utilizing the shuttle can opt to pick-up their child from camp on Friday evening in order to attend the closing ceremony.

Closing Ceremony

Closing Ceremonies begin at 4:30pm on the last day of camp. Closing Ceremony is especially designed for you and your family. Dismissal will be at 5:00pm. IMPORTANT THINGS TO KNOW



Car Decorating

We want to start a new tradition at Camp Carl by asking you and your campers decorate their cars for the trip and arrival to camp – with window paint, crepe paper, etc.. "Camp Carl 2017", their cabin/camper name, etc. It's a fun way to start the week, but certainly not required. You can purchase car markers at Wal-Mart, Hobby Lobby, or Michaels. You will receive a water bottle and a Camp Carl t-shirt for your efforts!

Lost and Found

Please check the Lost and Found table in the Lodge before leaving on the last day. If you realize your camper did not make it home with an item, please call Camp office at 330-315-5665 and leave a message describing the missing item(s). Claimed items will be returned C.O.D. Items will be held for one week. Unclaimed items will be donated to charity. Please label all items and make sure that you have all of your camper's belongings before you leave. Please note that Camp Carl cannot be responsible for lost or broken articles.

Camper Photos

Photos and videos of your camper, their cabin mates, and counselors will be posted on Facebook daily for you to view. We encourage you to pass on your photos to friends and family.

HEALTH INFORMATION

Every Camp Carl camper is required to fill out the Camp Carl Health Form online on your account. This should be completed prior to your camp week's start date.

Special Dietary Requirements

Camp Carl is concerned about your child's health and will gladly work with you regarding special dietary restrictions and requirements. We can accommodate a gluten-free or dairy-free diet. Please contact Camp Carl's Food Service Department by emailing Aaron.Uhl@campcarl.life or calling 330-315-5665 to review our menu and make the appropriate substitutions if available.

Lice Policy

For the safety, health and comfort of all campers, no child with untreated lice (bugs) or lice eggs (nits) on their person or belongings will be admitted to camp. Each child will be checked for lice/nits upon arrival to camp. If lice/nits are present, they must be treated prior to admittance to camp. Parents are responsible for treatment of both their camper's belongings camper's head when lice and or nits are found at camper check-in. Please check your child within 48 hours of arriving at camp (see www.headlice.org for more information). In order to properly perform a lice/nit check, ponytails must be removed prior to check. We will do our best to do lice checks around braids but any signs of lice or nits will require that braids be taken out.

HEALTH INFORMATION



Health Care Reminders

At Camp Carl, safety is our number one priority. Your child's safety and health are of the utmost importance to us and we will provide professional and responsible care while they are at camp. To maintain our standards of excellence, we follow the regulations of the the American Camp Association standards. Below are some suggestions that will improve your child's experience and expedite your check in process on Sunday.

We have a No Nit, No Lice policy. Please inspect your child(ren) 48 hours prior to camp for lice and/or nits. If found, please treat and remove ALL nits so that they can be admitted to camp. (There are a number of resources available that can assist you in this process. For your convenience, here is a sample website you can review:

 Please note that every child is also checked on their arrival day by a counselor and/or Health Care Professional.

All medications are required to be in the original packaging and contain only the medication identified on the container. Do not put two or more different medications in the same container.

If your child requires a prescription medication, the prescription label must be legible with the camper's name on it. Please do not use old bottles or those belonging to another family member as they will not be administered per state law.

Please check the medication's expiration date. Expired medication will not be administered per state law.

The ONLY medications that are permitted to be kept with the counselors are RESCUE inhalers and EPI pens. These are the only medications that our counselors are trained to administer. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact our Health Care Doctor during check-in.

We do not allow campers to keep these medications themselves as it poses a threat to other campers. A counselor that has your child's rescue medication will be with your child at all times. The counselors are allowed to keep glucometers.

Please contact our office as soon as possible at campcarl@thechapel.life if your child has one or more of the following conditions:

- Requires any injectable medication
- Any seizure disorder
- o Autism
- Asperger's Syndrome

Any special situation that requires our attention. It is very beneficial for us to have this information as soon as possible so that we may prepare our counselors and staff.

If your child's medication will be coming with someone who is not familiar with the dose and administration time, please be sure to send a note with the exact information. Medication administration times are during Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner and at Bedtime. Please choose which med call times you will prefer.

If your child has surgery, a fracture or serious injury within six weeks of camp, please contact our office as a physician's release will be required.

If contagious illness 7 days prior to camp, please contact our office to discuss specifics.

All medications will be returned on Friday. Medications that are left over are disposed of so please be sure to stop by our Medication Return table in the Lodge on Friday.

Cabin Mate Requests

At Camp Carl, we will do our best to honor up to three cabin mate requests per camper. Groups larger than three, we will do our best to get everyone together, but can't guarantee.

Cancellations

Campers who cancel before June 1, 2017 will be refunded all payments except the non-refundable deposit of \$50. If this reservation is cancelled for any reason after June 1, 2017, all monies paid will be non-refundable. All cancellation requests must be submitted via e-mail to campcarl@thechapel.life. All payments are non-transferrable. Registrations not paid in full the Friday before the Sunday drop-off may be subject to automatic cancellation.

Communications

The best way to contact Camp Carl is through e-mail. Please address all correspondence to campcarl@thechapel.life. We check our e-mail regularly and respond in a timely manner. You may also call 330-315-5665. Campers may not email or call home.

Camper Check-Out Policy

Campers will be released only into the care of the adult assigned in the registration process. If other than the parent, we require an Alternative Pick-Up Form to be completed on line or during check-in.

Contacting Your Camper
