Program Information

The Camp EDMO After School Program will run from the first day of school on August 20, 2018 to the last day of school on June 7, 2019. This program runs daily from the end of the school day until 6:00pm each day. As a highly subsidized program funded by a state grant, it is required that all students attend the program for the full duration each day. If for any reason your child is unable to attend the program for the full length on any day, you **MUST** fill out a waiver (attached to this handbook and also available in person at the program). The program will be off on the following dates to allow for staff professional development: Friday, 11/16/2018; Friday 12/21/2018; Friday 3/29/2019.

Behavior Expectations

We believe that all students in our program have a right to enjoy the program without other students detracting from their learning and fun. In accordance with this, we expect students to think of others in the program and engage with all students and staff in a responsible and respectful manner. If a student displays disruptive behavior in the program, we will address the issue the first time it happens and bring it to the attention of the student's family. If the behavior continues, Camp EDMO staff will work with the family and the student to develop an Action Plan that will outline clear expectations and guidelines for the student to remain in the program. If the behavior persists even after the Action Plan is in place, the student may be asked to leave the program.

A daily snack will be provided by the Alameda School District. This snack will be healthy and free of nuts. If you would like to provide your own snack, please let us know so we can make adjustments with the district provider.

Program Communication

Camp EDMO will be sending out a monthly newsletter with information about the program. This newsletter will include information on the topic students have been working on during enrichment as well as a peak into the topic for the following month. This newsletter will be emailed to the primary email on the account as well as available in printed form during pick up from the program.

Check-Out Information

Please note, Camp EDMO will require any person picking up a student from the program to show a photo ID when picking up. In order to pick up a student from the program, the individual picking up must be on the authorized pick up list. If you need to add a person to the authorized pick up list, please reach out to Helena Ortiz. Students will be checked out from the grass field or their classrooms. Upon arrival to the school, please check the whiteboard at the front gate for up to date information on each grade level location.
