—a weekend full of unplugging, connecting, and growing in your relationship


with each other and with God. Here's everything you need to know as you

Island Location & Transportation

- The camp takes place on Camp Shamineau's 22-acre Island on Lake Shamineau.
- You'll take a pontoon shuttle out to the Island on Friday evening and return to the mainland on Sunday around 10:30 AM.



Check-in at 6:00 PM. We will shuttle out at 6:30 PM.

If you're arriving after 6:30 PM on Friday, please call us at 218-575-2240 to make arrangements.

Lodging, Meals, & Open Recreation

- The Island has 5 screened-in cabins, each with 5 sets of bunks (sleeps 10) and wood floors.
- No electricity in the cabins—bring a flashlight!
- The Island Lodge has electricity for minimal charging and there is cell service, though limited.

Dads and sons will be housed in the same cabins. If you are coming with a group, be sure to indicate that on your registration. You will be sharing housing with other Dads and sons.

Meals

 All meals will be prepared over an open fire with your participation—it's all part of the experience!

Get ready for outdoor adventures like fishing, archery, swimming, canoeing, campfire cooking, shelter building, and simply enjoying God's creation.

Insurance Coverage

Camp Shamineau carries excess medical coverage. This means that any medical bill resulting from injury to a camper must first be submitted to the patient's health carrier. Illness treated at camp must be covered by the patient. Hospitals are available in Staples, Little Falls, and Brainerd for emergencies. On our staff we have a number of First Responders and EMT's.
