This week in the Tots Special class, we focused on the meaning of the 4th of July and firework safety. The campers played patriotic bingo and made their own fake sparklers. Next week is Earth Week and we're going to make sun catchers after we collect leaves and flowers outside. We're also going to talk about recycling and what materials go in the recycling bin versus the trash.
