Picasso the Parrot is returning as Summer Art Studio's mascot!
Part of our camp's culture is embodying qualities that help make camp fun—where we all strive to be the best that we can be. Parrot stands for:

Each day, Summer Art Studio has an award ceremony where several campers are nominated to become part of Picasso's Parrot Patrol. Out of the number nominated, the staff chooses two campers, one from the junior division and one from the senior division to win a specialized Picasso pin, and they become part of the Parrot Patrol – helping us scout out other campers that also embody the PARROT qualities.

CRAN BAGS

At the end of each day, we are offering a special activity where campers can purchase shirts from previous years and turn them into a tote bag! We decorate them, paint them, and bead them, too! If your camper would like to participate, it's \$5/shirt, which can be charged to your account.

JUST A REMINDER

- Two snacks and lunch (if opted for) are provided for your camper each day.
- On Tuesdays and Thursdays, we swim at the Williams Natatorium, so please remember to bring a bathing suit and towel!
- Drop off is from 8:45 9:00 am and pick up is from 3:00 3:15 pm.
- During pick-up and drop-off, continue to move as far forward as possible. Please do not exit your vehicle when you are in line, staff will be available to help your camper enter and exit through the passenger side doors. Once your camper is in your vehicle, please do not pull around cars in front of you still loading campers; remain in line.
- Open-toed footwear is not allowed at Summer Art Studio. This is a safety issue. Examples of acceptable footwear are: Sneakers, tennis shoes, etc.

This summer, our two Gallery Shows are taking place on Friday, July 12th and Friday, August 9th from 2:00 until 3:00.

The first Gallery Show will be a time to come and celebrate all of the art that has been created during the first session of Summer Art Studio, displayed in a gallery format, curated by your campers (with a little help from instructors). This is also a great time to meet and talk with your camper's favorite instructors and assistants! Parents, grandparents, family, and friends are all welcome and encouraged to attend!

Our Gallery Shows are "Take Away" Galleries. What this means is that once a camper has guided his or her family through the Gallery, they will be permitted to take all of their projects down from the walls/ off of the tables and are free to leave. In order to see the Gallery in its fullest presentation we encourage you to arrive closer to the start time.

If your camper isn't coming to camp during Week 4 (July 8-12) and/or Week 8 (August 5-9) but he/she would still like to attend our Gallery Show, we will gladly hold on to and display their selected art at the upcoming Gallery Show, which you are more than welcome to return for!

On these Gallery Show Fridays we will also be tie-dyeing!

This is always an exciting activity for campers but a very messy one too! Please make sure they do not wear their favorite outfit or new shoes on Friday if they will be tie-dyeing.

If your camper would like to participate, they can bring 1 large item (tshirt, pillowcase, etc.) or two small items (socks, bandana, etc.). Items should be white and at least 80% Cotton. If the items are new, make sure they have been washed.

This is a great time to make an old shirt look new again! Multi-washed items work best in this process.

We also have white Summer Art Studio t-shirts and aprons available for purchase, which can be tie-dyed in addition to or instead of the 1 large, or 2 small items brought from home. Each item is \$10 and can be charged to your account.

At Home Instructions for Tie-Dye

Campers will bring their creations home in a zip lock bag. Items should sit overnight in the Ziploc bag and then they should be rinsed under cold water until water runs clear, rubber bands removed, and washed separately in cold water for the first couple of washes.
