Tie-Dye Week 5

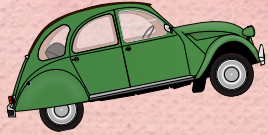
During the week of **July 19th**, we will be Tie-Dying!

Drop-Off & Pick-Up



Morning Drop-Off

Drop off is between 8:45AM - 9:00AM

- All campers **must** remain in vehicles until counselors are outside no earlier than 8:45 AM to ensure everyone's safety
- Campers are **not** to exit vehicles and enter Kingswood unattended before 8:45 am
- If you are dropping your child earlier, they will be taken to extended care and your account may be charged

Afternoon Drop-Off

Pick-Up: 2:50 pm

- All drivers on your campers' "Authorized to Pick-Up" list **MUST** have an "Authorized to Pick-Up" form in their passenger window
 - Form must contain child's full name and group number to help get your camper to you quickly
- The "Authorized to Pick-Up" form is located in the Document Center online
- Those not on your "Authorized to Pick-Up" list will have their photo ID checked
- Please stay in your car at the curb during pick-up while counselors bring your child to you
- If you pick your child up early, you **MUST** call or email the office

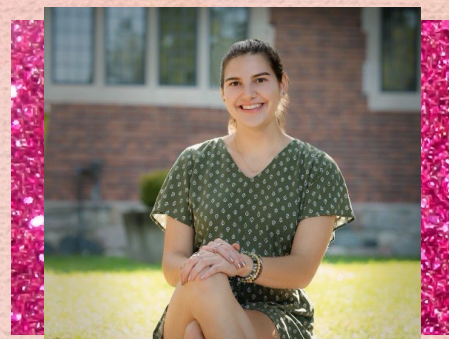

Yoga

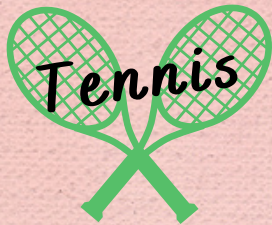

Hi, I'm Ava, the Drama instructor! We had so much fun in drama this week! Throughout the week the campers learned about movement. We had a lot of discussions about movement, as well as a deeper understanding of the intentions and motivation when it comes to different scenes. Next week the older campers will begin scene work, and younger campers will continue to work on improv and working together as an ensemble!



Hi, I'm Sara, the Music instructor! This week the campers learned all about the different musical instruments. After they learned about the different instruments, they went outside and played a game of instrument trivia where each corner of the field was labeled with a different instrument family. They were given a clue and they had to run to the family the instrument belongs to. In addition to learning about different instruments, the campers were able to try out their musical knowledge and guess songs from Disney musicals.
