





Drop Off and Pick-up:


Young Authors Day Camp runs each day from 9:15-3:15 Drop off begins at 9:00 each morning and ends at 9:15. If your child is going to be late please email or call us so we can plan accordingly! Pick up is from 3:15-3:30 each afternoon. All parents must join the pick up line and **REMAIN** in the line until they are instructed to pull forward. Any campers not picked up by 3:30 will be put on the bus to after-care at Brookside! You will then need to pick your child up from there! Please have the authorized pick-up form ready each day at pick up!

Author Share and Anthology:

We love showcasing the work that our campers do each week. We encourage all parents to purchase a Young Author's Anthology which includes one piece of writing from each of our campers every week! The anthology is \$20.00 and can be purchased via Ultracamp. Author Share on Fridays is our CLOSED camp event for just campers and staff. However, parents are encouraged to have their campers share their work with them at home!
