



WHAT TO BRING

- A friend (Encourage a friend to register with you!)
- Bible
- Clothes for each day, including:
 - Long jeans for riding horses
 - Layers suitable for Camp Wawona's climate (hot during the day, cold at night)
 - Pajamas
 - Optional, church clothes for Sabbath
 - Closed-toed shoes* camper can get dirty (and back-up pair, as these may get wet)
- Swimming towel & bathing suit (one-piece for girls) or swim trunks
- Disposable camera (optional) with your name written on it
- Flashlight & batteries
- Water bottle
- Toiletries and Personal Care Items, including:
 - Insect repellent
 - Sunscreen / chap stick
 - Bath towel and shower supplies
- Laundry bag
- Sleeping bag & pillow
- Store money
- Forms and Paperwork
 - Consent to treat
 - Health History
 - Release and Application for Exemption from Physical Examination
 - Liability Waiver
 - Video Release Form
 - Violence and Graffiti Waiver

DRESS CODE

We would rather have campers and not their clothing be the focus at Camp Wawona, so we ask campers to follow a simple, modest dress code, which is also designed to ensure their safety as they engage in many of our activities. Parents, please ensure that the clothing your camper packs reflect the following:

- For girls, please leave any low cut and revealing swimsuits at home and bring a modest one-piece suit
- For boys, regular swim trunks are suitable for camp. No Speedo-type swimsuits.
- No bare midriff or low cut tops
- No excessively low cut and tight pants
- No cut-off, extremely tight, or short shorts (under 5" inseam)

Any logos or images on your clothing must not be sexual or vulgar in nature, in accordance with our Christian camp setting. For safety reasons, it is suggested that long hair be tied back during activities.

***Closed-toed shoes are required at all times.** Tennis shoes, sneakers, hiking shoes/boots are appropriate for most camp activities. Sandals and flip-flops will be allowed at the pool only.

WHAT NOT TO BRING

- Electronics of any kind, including cell phones, iPods/ other mp3 players, CD players, computers, video games, etc.)
- Weapons, knives, multi-tools
- Jewelry of any kind *
- Immodest clothing or other items that promote non-Christian values
- Animals of any kind
- Tobacco, alcoholic, or non-prescription drugs
- Personal sports equipment, such as skateboards, bicycles, climbing harnesses, helmets, etc.

Any item on the above list found in a campers' possession on check-in day will be taken to the office for safe storage until check-out on Sunday. Campers will not have access to these items until they check-out. If an item is hidden and later found by a staff member, the camper's parents may be contacted. A camper may face dismissal in circumstances involving a weapon. Please **DO NOT ALLOW** your camper to bring any of the above items to camp.

*Please leave all jewelry at home. Camp Wawona will not be responsible for the loss of jewelry or other items. Dangling or loose items can also be a safety risk. No chains or bracelets, except for medical purposes, will be allowed at camp.
