# Camp Gan Israel Plano Texas 2020

## Communicable Disease Plan (CDP)

In the event that a child or staff member is showing, clear symptoms or has a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the camp setting or when at later at home we will initiate our CDP to help control the spread of the virus.

After confirmation of a probable case, we will take the following steps:

- 1. If case presents itself while in in our facilities, we will isolate the child with the symptoms and ask the parents to come pick up their child and have them monitor their child for further developing symptoms.
- 2. We will notify local health officials, staff, and families immediately of a possible case while maintaining confidentiality as required by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)
- 3. We will close off areas used by anyone suspected of illness and will not use them again until cleaning and disinfection has occurred. We will ensure safe and correct application of disinfectants and keep disinfectant products away from children.
- 4. We will inform those exposed to a person with COVID-19 to stay home and self-monitor for symptoms, and follow CDC guidance if symptoms develop. We will monitor State and local health department notices daily about transmission in the area and adjust operations accordingly.
- 5. In the event a person diagnosed with COVID-19 is determined to have been in the building and poses a risk to the community, we will determine whether closing for a short time (1-2 days) for cleaning and disinfection is necessary.
- 6. We have designated a staff person to be responsible for responding to COVID-19 concerns.

#### Protocol to return to the program

### Scenario 1

If a camper has a temperature over 100 F, they will be sent home immediately. Any siblings will have to leave camp as well at this time.

It is highly recommended to get a Rapid COVID test (we suggest: location)

If test is negative, then child may return to camp once they are fever free without fever reducing medications for 24 hours.

### Scenario 2

If a camper tests positive for COVID, that child will be unable to return to camp until 14 days have passed from onset of symptoms and/or 2 negative COVID test results.

After local authorities complete their risk assessment, it will be determined if the other children in the bunk need to be quarantined.

### Scenario 3

If a parent or household member test positive for COVID, the child/ren in the household must be quarantined for 14 days after the sick person has been cleared of COVID.

The other campers in the children's bunks in this situation would NOT need to be quarantined according to the CDC.
