When and where do I drop-off my camper?

Check-in is Monday morning 11:00am - 12:30pm in the parking lot right off of Main Street in Marblehead near the entrance to the Kelleys Island Ferry and across from the Marblehead Police station.

When and where do I pick-up my camper?

Pick-up is Saturday from 10:15am - 11:00am, you can pick up your camper at the same location as drop-off (see address above).

How can I view pictures of my camper during the week?

Photos are uploaded to our Facebook page on a daily basis during the camp week. Please know, we try to get pictures of as many campers as possible, but may not always have one of your specific camper(s). Can I send my camper letters during the week?

Of course! Mail to the island is a little slower, so in order for letters to be received on time, we recommend sending letters at the beginning of the week. You can also email your camper at <u>info@camppatmos.com</u>. *Make sure your camper's name and* **program** (e.g. Junior, Middle School, High School) are in the subject line.

What is the dress code for campers?

Campers should bring clothes they can be active in. This includes tennis shoes and water shoes! Shorts should be finger-tip length with arms extended straight at the sides. Campers with short shorts and revealing tops will be asked to change. Swimsuits for girls need to be one-piece or modest tankini's that cover camper's midsection. No speedos for guys.



Can I visit my camper?

We would love for you to come see where your camper will be staying for the week. You are welcome to join your camper on the ferry ride over to Kelleys Island and the tram ride to camp on check-in day. You can purchase your ferry ticket before heading to camp, and if you tell them you are coming to Camp Patmos, you will receive a small discount. Please wait by the camp office for our parent camp/island tour to begin around 1:30-2:00. The tour will last about two hours and will conclude with a drop off at the ferry for parents to return to the mainland. *We require that you sign-up during camp check-in on Monday as you drop off your camper(s).*

For the safety of all campers, we do not allow visitors during the camp week other than the scheduled Monday drop off and tour listed above. Visitors must always check-in at the camp office directly upon arriving at the camp.

What should my camper bring to camp?

- 1. ALL medications, supplements, essential oils etc. in original containers
- 2. Medical Form (if not completed online required for ALL campers)
- 3. Bible, notebook, and pen
- 4. Bedding: Sleeping bag, pillow, etc.
- 5. Toiletries: soap, shampoo, etc.
- 6. Modest one-piece swimsuit or tankini that covers midsection for girls. No speedos for guys.
- 7. Swimsuit cover-up
- 8. Towels for waterfront/pool AND showers
- 9. Tennis shoes or closed-toed shoes for biking and other activities
- 10. Water shoes
- 11. Money for Friday offering, Camp Patmos merchandise/souvenirs, snacks, drinks, and crafts
- 12. Flashlight
- 13. Insect repellent
- 14. Sunscreen, Sunscreen, Sunscreen
- ****We recommend NOT bringing cell phones



If I did not deposit money into my camper's store account online, how much money should my camper bring to camp?

Souvenirs and snacks are available in our Blue Sail Camp Store which range in price. Our camp T-shirts start at \$25 and snacks range from \$.25 to \$5.00. Campers typically bring \$40-\$75 to spend during the week.

Junior Campers are required to put their money in a Blue Sail account online or during check-in, if this was not done online during the application process, and any unused funds will be returned to them at the end of the week or donated to camp as requested.
