



Camp Pugwash COVID-19 Operational Plan for Summer of 2021

We are excited to announce that we will be running day camps across the Maritimes for six weeks. We will be abiding by COVID-19 regulations for Day Camps. The specific locations and dates are as follows:

North Sydney Day Camp | July 5–9, 2021

Halifax/Dartmouth Day Camp | July 12–16, 2021

Pugwash Day Camp | July 19–23, 2021

Charlottetown Day Camp | July 26–30, 2021

Moncton Day Camp | August 2–6, 2021

St. John Day Camp | August 9–13, 2021

Guidelines and Protocols

Camps will operate with cohorts of 8 – 10 campers and will abide by COVID-19 regulations.

- Arrival and pick-up will be completely contactless and will be done through a drive-thru process.
- Campers will be directed to follow regulations on arrival and will be reminded throughout the day to ensure proper social distancing and sanitization.
- Campers will go through a pre-screening process every day before leaving the vehicle. This includes checking of symptoms and temperature. If a camper has two or more symptoms (One symptom, if the symptom is purple toes and fingers), campers will be sent home and will be advised to call 811. Campers will not be able to return to camp until fully recovered. These specifics have been advised by Public Health. If campers are sent home, we will offer a prorated rebate.
- Premises will be sanitized and cleaned frequently by staff.
- Protective measures will be strictly used, such as frequent handwashing and mask-wearing when social distancing between cohorts is impossible.

- Cohorts will comprise of 8 – 10 campers which will stay consistent throughout the week. These campers will eat together and do all activities/classes together. Campers will not be required to wear masks inside of their cohort as per government guidelines but will be advised to stay aware of other's personal space. When interacting with another cohort, campers will be required to wear their masks and social distance.
- Campers will be given coloured wrist bands that will distinguish between cohorts. These wrist bands will help campers identify cohorts and assist campers in being aware of who to social distance with.
